Spotlight on the Lodge of St Giles

In the early 1970s there were masons in Corby and the surrounding area who considered that another Lodge could be justified, in particular a number who resided in Desborough who felt that they could raise a new Lodge to support the Brethren of Thistle & Rose who were endeavoring to build their own premises in Corby.

Accordingly the new Lodge was formed taking its name from the Churches of St Giles in Desborough, Edinburgh and London. The formation of the Lodge gave a boost to the financial standing of the building fund thus enabling the work to continue on the building of the Masonic complex in Corby.

The Lodge was consecrated on the 30th October 1976, at the Kettering Masonic Hall, its first master being an emanate mason at the time WBro JA McKean, with a well-known mason of today in the person of WBro Stuart

Geekie as the Senior Warden. The first regular took place at the Lutheran Hall in Corby and meetings continued there until September 1978 when the Lodge moved to its present home at the Corby Masonic Complex in Rockingham Road.

It is a fact that included in the Lodges list of honorary members is the MW Bro The Rt Hon, The Earl of Elgin and Kincardine, Past Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Scotland.

These days the Lodge meets on the First Tuesday from September to May with the exception of January when the second Tuesday is preferred. The current master is Bro Milan Crooks who is pictured welcoming the new Lodge Secretary WBro Arthur McNeil. Corby Freemasons in the Community

On Thursday 8 November the masters of the Corby Lodges assisted by the Corby Group officers were very proud to be able to present a cheque for £3379 to Lee and Suzanne of the Autumn Centre. The Corby Lodges raised £1800 and the Northants and Hunts Provincial Grand Lodge provided the uplift to meet the entire projected cost for urgently required tables and chairs.



The not-for-profit charity day centre for the over 50s in Corby and the surrounding villages is provided in a centre on the Counts Farm Road in Corby. They provide a heavily subsidised service for their members with free membership for all, a door to door escorted transport service, healthy well balanced meals, free activities including four chair exercise sessions a week to help people keep active and prevent slips, trips and falls.

The majority of the members have physical disabilities but they also help people living with all different types of deementia, Parkinsons disease, Huntingdons disease, mental health issues and abuse.

Their aim is to combat loneliness, social isolation and to help build self-worth and confidence.

He received his Jubilee certificate from the Provincial Grand Masters representative W Bro. Francis Margot. Over 60 brothers sat down to the Festive Board after the presentation. Bro Paul was initiated into Cytringan Lodge L4048 on 2 January 1967. As a musician he was very soon enlisted to assist other Lodges when they were in need of an organist, in particular Thistle and Rose Lodge who at that time met in the Lutheran Hall. Following a working life spent away from the area he retired back amongst us in 1999 and met up again with two old Kettering Grammar School chums, W. Bros. Trevor Wayman & Ken Marris - both attended the ceremony, although they no longer do his homework.
