It was great to have the Craft Provincial Grand Master of Bedfordshire installed as the PGM for the Royal Order in our Complex, what a superb way to re-launch masonry in Corby.

It is fantastic to see Karen McNamee return as our Bar & Catering Manager, she is indeed the "Head Cook & Bottle Washer" assisted by committee members and others there is an effective management team in place that is working towards making our centre a success for the foreseeable future.

Without doubt the path back to normality will have further obstacles, the virus is still with us, restrictions in all probability will be required at certain times, the centre will at all times follow guidance from the Provincial Office

So far the response from you all has been amazing, since the re-opening there have been a total of 21 meetings with 677 meals served clearly the strategy of re-opening as a masonic only centre is providing confidence that our complex is a safe place for masons to come.

The re-organisation of the bar and members lounge area to create a new dining facility more suited to the expected requirements on resumption of activities has been so well received. We are eternally grateful for the knowledge and expertise of all those who made it possible.

The Member's Pathway

The key objective of this new national initiative is that every single brother should be able to contribute to ensuring that Freemasonry thrives, building a Fraternity for the 21st century and for a new generation of Freemasons!

The pathway encourages Lodges to plan for the future, work out how best to attract tomorrow's masons, whilst engaging with today's membership



The most important attribute for the brethren managing this process is the ability to LISTEN

The Members Pathway Program for the Corby is led by the Senior Group Officer WBro Jim Spence, who is assisted by W Bro Harry Twelvetrees, WBro Steve Burton & WBro Alex Henderson.

Early progress

Planning & Attraction - The United Grand Lodge of England of Freemasonry have commissioned a digital marketing campaign to attract new members, for sure there is significant new interest in the fraternity in the Corby area, in our Lodges a total of 10 applicants have now completed their interview process and have dates for initiation this season. On average we received a couple of enquires each week.

Engagement / Retrieval & Retention - Before the pandemic Lodge registers were introduced, these have proved to be invaluable in being able to identify and then engage with our membership, whilst we are averaging 25+ per meeting there is a significant cohort of members who are not attending. Clearly there are some Brethren who are not ready to return due to the pandemic.

Anecdotal evidence also suggests other reasons for non-attendance

- Some older masons and those with mobility issues suggest they do not attend or only attend now and again because evening meetings are too late; some brethren say that do not like eating after 7pm, some have mobility issues and get tired in the evenings.
- Brethren do not have role in the Lodge (Past Masters)

Several members have suggested that a locally based daytime Lodge would work very well and be assured of regular support with a ready number of applicants from the older members of the community and those with mobility issues.

Next Steps

The Pathway team will look to work with each Lodge to develop plans for the future that are commensurate with the overall Pathway plan. A start up session will take place with the Corby Masonic Management Committee, which consists of an elected representative from each Lodge, as part of the next regular CMC meeting.


